*“Anyone who does not renounce all his possessions cannot be my disciple.” Luke 14:25-33*

“Ah, Jesus, can’t I just keep my IPOD?” Jesus might point out that He said *renounce* [from the Latin words *re* = back and *nuntiare* = tell, meaning: *To give up a claim, right, belief, practice, way of living, feeling, etc.*]. He might add, “You may use that IPOD, but you may not claim that it, or anything else you think you own, actually belongs to you. Everything you *think* you possess comes from God and belongs to God, who wants you to have what you need to enjoy life, but not if that means others must do without the necessities of life.” That is a hard concept for people in the United States, who cling doggedly to the right to property, to understand and accept. As stewards of all we have, God expects us to work out how much we need for ourselves and those for whom we are responsible, and how much we should share with others in need. So Jesus would probably say, “Enjoy My IPOD, and let others enjoy it too.”

“I did not want to do anything without your consent, so that the good you do might not be forced but voluntary.” Stewardship includes identifying the opportunities to live our baptismal call and the gifts or natural abilities that God has given us to exercise this call. When our gifts or natural abilities do not fit the ministry or opportunity, our response may feel forced. When our gifts or natural abilities fit the ministry or opportunity, we experience the joy of giving. Seek the joy.

**September 7th - St. Regina** – martyr; was an actual martyr at Autun, France; legend has her as the daughter of a pagan, Clement, and tortured and beheaded during the second century when she refused to marry the proconsul Olybrius.

**September 8th - St. Adrian** - legend has it Adrian was a pagan officer at the imperial court of Nicomedia; Impressed by the courage of a group of Christians who were being tortured, he declared himself a Christian and was imprisoned with them and suffered excruciating tortures before he was put to death. His young wife, Natalia, who was present at his death, comforted him in his agony, recovered one of his severed hands, and took it to Argyropolis near Constantinople, where she fled to escape the importunities of an imperial official of Nicomedia who wanted to marry her. Adrian is the patron of soldiers and butchers.

**September 9th - St. Peter Claver** – priest; called to eternal life 8 September 1654; Catalonian Jesuit who served in the Columbian mission in Cartagena; for thirty-eight years devoted to caring for African slaves, baptizing over 300,000; called himself “the slave of the slaves forever”; patron of Columbia and of all missions to black people. This memorial has been newly included in the Universal Calendar in the *Missale Romanum, edition typical tertia*, as an optional memorial.
